A Note to Visitors

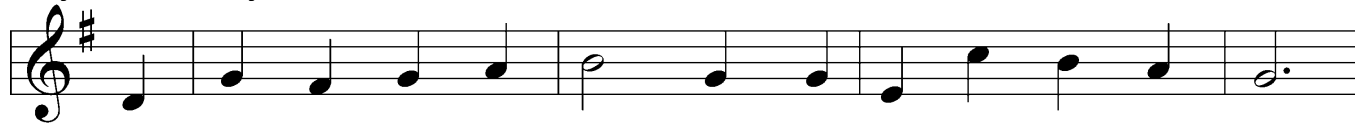

Offerings: You may give in the plate at the entrance to the sanctuary. All donations are used to support the preaching of God's Word.

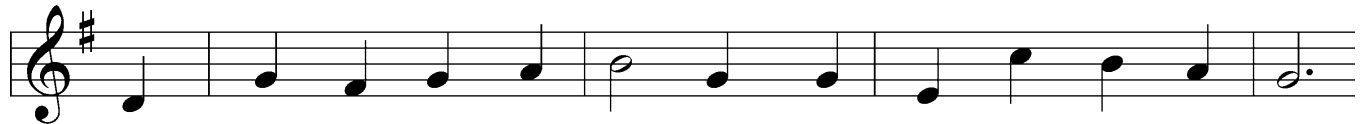
